Many of them have cross-disciplinary interests in areas related to Chemical Engineering, all branches of Chemical Technology, Pharmacy, Medicinal Chemistry, Intellectual Property Rights, Biochemical Engineering and Biotechnology, Material Sciences and Technology, and Energy Engineering. Pandit Madan Mohan Malaviya National Centre for Teachers and Trainers:</p> <p>The Institute has received the approval for financial assistance for establishing the faculty development centre under 'Pandit Madan Mohan Malaviya National Mission on Teachers and Teaching' (PMMMNMTT), an activity under Rashtriya Uchchatar Shiksha Abhiyan's (RUSA) approved by MHRD.</p> <p>The Faculty Development Centre established at Institute of Chemical Technology Mumbai (ICT) under the aegis of RUSA, Maharashtra would train teachers in Pharmacy stream on the three newly designed courses and pursue a long-term goal of building a strong professional cadre of teachers by upgrading their skill and improving the employability opportunity for the students.</p> <p>PMMMNMTT sponsored three faculty development courses are:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none">1. 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attending the course. The faculty for both the programmes was from Industry and was identified by ICT faculty.

Third programme on Industrial Pharmacy is scheduled in the month of February (dates are not finalized yet, tentatively third week of February, 2019).

The programme will continue for total three years.

Funding from PMMMNTT has been received and a pilot plant is proposed to be built in ICT Mumbai and is at advanced stage of planning.

The first of such laboratory was established for then Directors of the Institute through the funding received from Professor K. Venkatraman. Unfortunately, this was discontinued after the retirement of Professor M.M. Sharma.</p> <p>In persuasion to have the independent research laboratory and in line with the vision of the Institute, the Vice Chancellor has requested Dr. A.V. Ramarao, Chairman and Managing Director, AVRA Laboratories Pvt. Ltd. for the donation for establishing the research laboratories for Vice Chancellor and Pro Vice Chancellor. Dr. A.V. 	<p>Shri Mokashi suggested that this loan from General Fund should be called as “advance from General Fund” in all the records pertaining to this subject.</p> <p>(ii) The Enquiry Committee for the case of Professor V.V. Shertukde has reported the completion of inquiry and shall submit the final report within next 15 days.</p> <p>(iii) Some of the temporary support staff working at the main campus is absorbed at Marathwada campus and ICT-IOC campus as provided under Statutes 23(a).
